Worms: a lurking infestation.

Worms are parasites that live on blood or undigested food in the intestines of the host.

In South Africa up to 56% of children may have worms, even from as young as 12 months

old. Worms are easy to get but they are just as easy to get rid of.

There are many ways that worms can infect people. Worms are spread through simply walking barefoot. They live in garden soil, in children's sandpits, beach sand and play-grounds.

Worm eggs can also adhere to clothing and bed linen where they contaminate hands. Most eggs are tiny enough to float on dust and enter our bodies when we breathe in. They can be picked up from pet fur. Worms can also be ingested from raw meat or fruit and vegetables that aren't rinsed properly.

With pets in our homes, sandpits at their schools and the food we eat, every family is at risk of getting worms.

You cannot be immunized against worms.

But you can:

- Always wash your hands after going to the loo, before handling food, or after playing with animals.
- Keep your nails short and scrubbed. Children should take a bath or shower after playing in the sand, sandpits or on the beach
- Wash all salads and vegetables thoroughly
- Do not eat raw or undercooked beef or pork

- Loss of appetite or vomiting
- Constipation
- Weight loss
- Diarrhoea, blood stained stool
- Anaemia
- Worms in stool
- Worms coming up the throat into the mouth
- Slight Fever
